In pursuance of Section 12 of an Act of Congress providing for a Delegate to the House of Representatives, approved May 7th, 1906, the undersigned met at Juneau, Alaska, on the 22nd day of October, 1906, to canvass the votes cast for Delegates from Alaska at the election held August 14, 1906, and found that (Frank H. Waskey, of Nome, had received the greatest number of votes cast for Delegate for the short term ending March 4th, 1907,) <sup>60th Cong.</sup> and Thomas Cale, of Fairbanks, had received the greatest number of votes for Delegate from Alaska for the long term beginning March 4th, 1907,) and certificates of election have been issued to them accordingly. The vote was as follows:

For Delegate for short term: Waskey. Murane. Swineford. Scattering.
