Sec. 12 And be it further enacted, That from and after the passage of this act, all that part of California embraced within the following boundaries, that is to say: Beginning at the intersection of the line of 36 degrees and 30 minutes of north latitude with the shore of the Pacific Ocean, thence due east to the western boundary line of New Mexico, thence south by and with said boundary line to its intersection with the boundary line between the United States and Mexico as established under the treaty concluded at Guadalupe Hidalgo on the second day of February, eighteen hundred and forty eight, thence westward by and with the said last mentioned boundary line to the shore of the Pacific Ocean, thence with the said shore to the place of beginning, including the islands along the said shore opposite and belonging to that part of the coast of California; shall form a separate territory to be known and called the territory of Colorado
